

### III. Yishuv Candidacy

- A. Upon acceptance to the Garin and approval by the Jewish Agency, Garin members can move to the temporary caravans at Har Chalutz. This, however, does not imply automatic acceptance to the Yishuv. The first group to move to Har Chalutz will vote on each other for Yishuv membership after six months on the site. 2/3 vote is required for acceptance to the permanent Yishuv, as well as the approval of the Jewish Agency.
- B. Garin members who move to the site after the first group, are voted on by Yishuv members after they have been at the site for six months. Again, the approval of the Jewish Agency is also required.
- C. Garin members who live out of the Karmiel area will be required to live on the site 6-12 months before being voted on for membership in the permanent Yishuv.
- D. Garin members arriving from the U.S. are exempt from the 3-6 month "potential" period, but are required to live on the site for 6-9 months before being voted on for membership in the permanent Yishuv.
- E. Newly-arrived immigrants with no Israel experience *must* live in the Merkaz Klita or a private apartment in Karmiel for at least three months prior to moving to the site.
- F. Garin members must move to the site no later than one year after their acceptance to the Garin, or arrival in Israel, unless delayed by the Jewish Agency. Otherwise, they forfeit the automatic right to move to the site as a Yishuv candidate. The right of appeal is given to any family, but re-acceptance requires the approval of both the Yishuv membership and the Jewish Agency.
